Port Authority H.R. and Labor Chief Leaves Legacy of Respect, Renewal

Mary Lee Hannell has a straightforward way of describing her job as the Port Authority's Chief of Human Resources and Labor Relations: Finding the right people, right place, right time.

Some days at the Port Authority, the answers to those statements were simple. Other days, like on Sept. 12, 2001, the answers were nearly impossible.

As Hannell prepares for retirement after 37 years at the Port Authority, the last

11 spent as Chief of Human Capital, she leaves an enduring legacy shaped by her pivotal actions in the days that followed 9/11, along with her determination to forge new traditions within an agency that had experienced profound loss.

On that Tuesday morning, Sept. 11, 2001, Hannell was in her office on the 67th floor of the North Tower when she felt a jolt and saw smoke. She opened the stairwell door and started an hour-long journey to the street level, pushing herself and others to stay positive and keep moving through thickening smoke and anxiety.

She has relived that mindset for days, weeks, and years since.
