# PAPD Spreads Awareness About New Safe Place Initiative

The Port Authority Police Department recently launched the Safe Place Initiative, which assists victims of hate crimes, at three Port Authority facilities. On Wednesday, July 10, members of the PAPD visited PATH Journal Square, the World Trade Center Oculus, and the Midtown Bus Terminal, where they passed out flyers and had meaningful face-to-face conversations with travelers and community members to

raise awareness of the program.

The Safe Place Initiative was originally created by the Seattle Police Department as an outreach effort to members of the local LGBTQ community, who were underreporting hate crimes and bias incidents. Today, as PAPD becomes the 357th police department across the country to adopt the program, it has expanded to include all victims of hate crimes.

# JFK Welcomes Passengers On Board Innovative Self-Driving Shuttle Bus

This summer, passengers flying out of JFK will have the unique opportunity to participate in the agency's first self-driving vehicle pilot to serve the traveling public.

On Thursday, July 18, the Planning and Regional Development Department traveled to JFK long-term parking Lot 9 to experience the agency's latest pilot of an autonomous Ohmio shuttle bus firsthand. The Innovation Hub pilot program is managed by Planning's own

Leo Tsang, who is enthusiastic about the pilot's mission to make access between AirTrain JFK stations and parked vehicles easier and guicker for customers.

The autonomous vehicle pilot currently underway at JFK is the agency's fourth test of self-driving technology at its major airports, but the first to be open to the public. This pilot builds on these previous efforts, including the groundbreaking demonstration of autonomous platooning at JFK last summer.

Members of the community who have been the victim of a hate crime can find a "Safe Place" by looking for a Safe Place sticker or poster displayed in the windows of one of the 82 Port Authority retailers across the 3 facilities who have agreed to participate in the program. These partner businesses provide victims with assistance in contacting law enforcement and a place to safely wait for help from PAPD to arrive.
