# PAPD Welcomes First Female Captain of Hispanic Heritage

Originally published in Now Arriving, written by Lenis Valens. For two decades, a stuffed puppy has followed Priscilla Sanchez everywhere she's gone. She's had it since she was 10, a much beloved gift from her brother just prior to his deployment to Iraq: "I held onto that puppy every night."

It was a source of comfort during his absence, and grew to symbolize even more.

"I looked at it and saw a reminder of his sacrifice, his service to something greater than himself," she said. "I knew I wanted to follow the same path."

The puppy's connection across generations has grown. It's now her children's turn to clutch Bingo the stuffed puppy as they watch Sanchez put on her own uniform, that of the Port Authority Police Department. Sanchez recently became PAPD's first female captain of Hispanic heritage, just days before welcoming her third son.

"I want women in law enforcement to see my success as their own, as we are strongest when we support one another in our shared battles," Sanchez said. "In a male-dominated field, it often takes twice the effort for us to keep pace, but by opening doors for one another, we can create a more equitable future."
