PAVA Gives Veterans a Voice

The Port Authority Veterans Association (PAVA) recently hosted its third annual Veterans Voice discussion, shining a spotlight on the incredible stories and experiences of our nation's veterans.

On November 13, days after the agency recognized Veterans Day, PAVA members, agency leadership, employees, and many others joined together for a day filled with inspiring stories, valuable resources, and connections with veterans. This annual inperson and virtual event gives veterans at the agency a chance to share their experiences, learn from others, and be a part of a supportive community.

To start off the event, the agency unveiled a recently relocated World War II plague that honors employees of the agency that served in WWII. It was previously located at New York Marine Terminals in Brooklyn.

Guest speakers included Terrance Hayes, Deputy Assistant Secretary, Office of Public and Intergovernmental Affairs (OPIA) and Marine Gunnery Sergeant Eliezer Gomez.

Hayes, who was appointed by President Biden earlier this year, leads the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' marketing and communications efforts, and serves as



"The accreditations will help the agency realize its vision of being a world-class operator of world-class airports," Aviation Director Charles R. Everett, Jr. said.


